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How Startup Valuation Works



Startup valuation is the process of estimating how much a startup is worth, usually to help determine how much equity to offer investors during funding rounds. This is done using methods based on factors like market potential, team expertise, comparable company analysis, revenue multiples, and projected growth, since early-stage startups often lack historical financial data

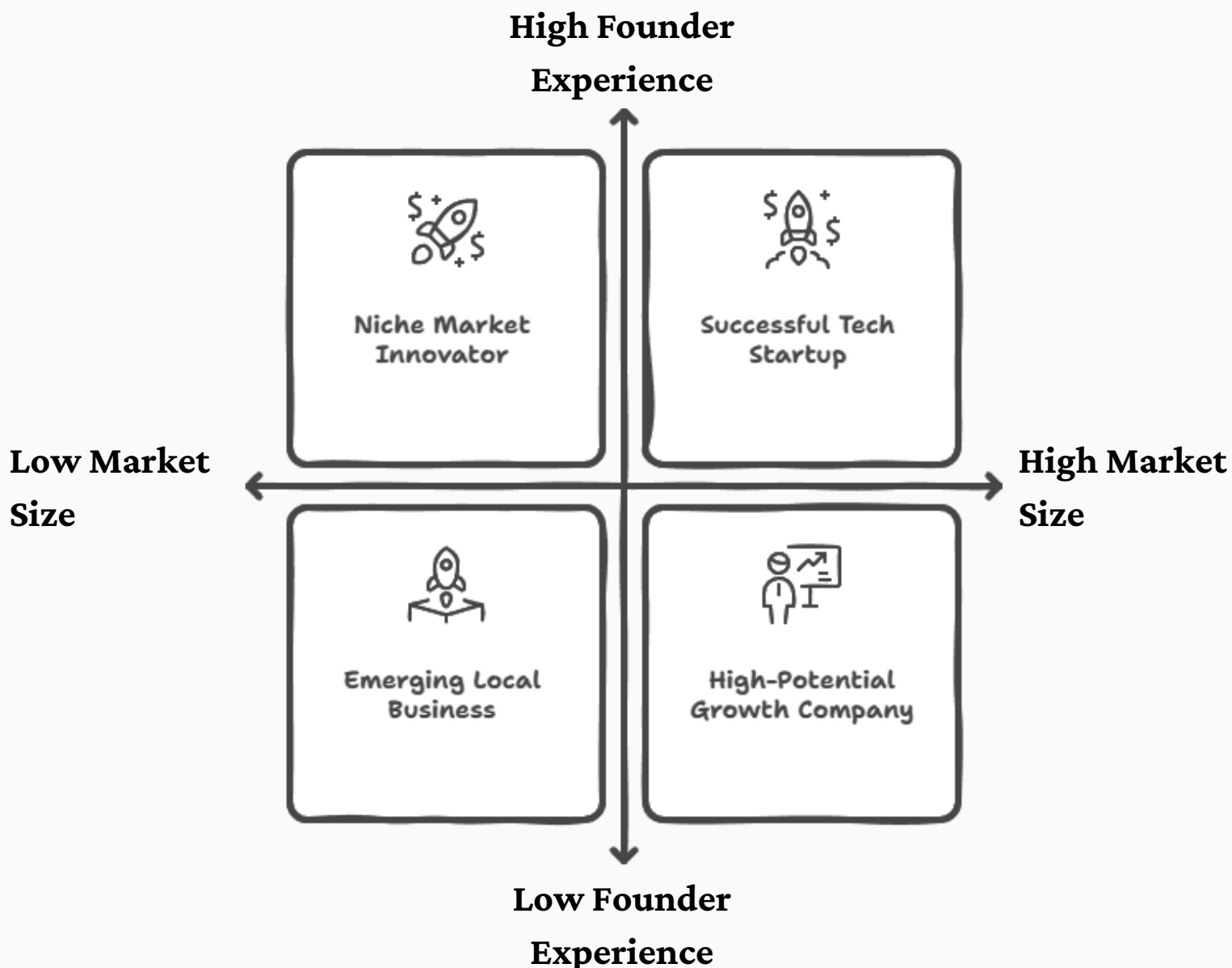
Venture Capital Method
