

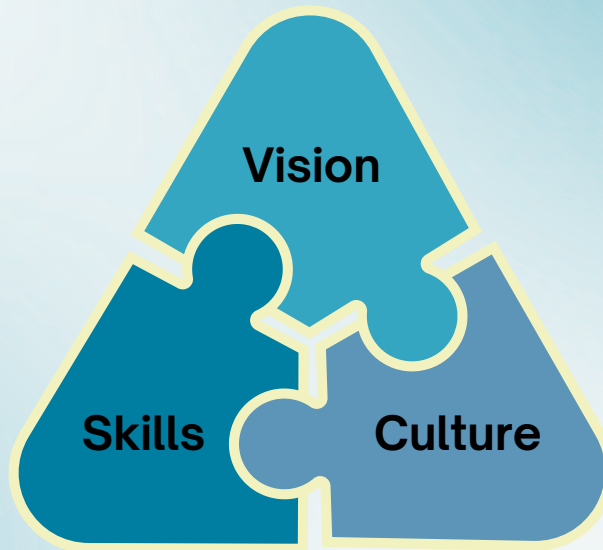

Investors bet on teams, not just ideas.

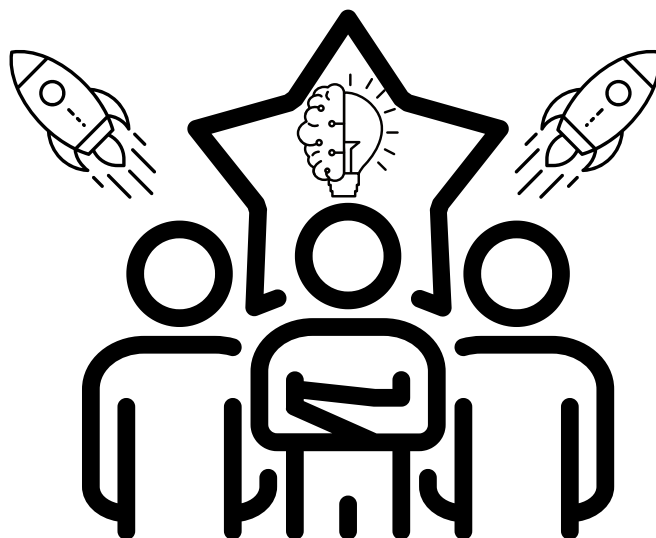
Why the Team Matters?

Marketing & Sales Lead (CMO)

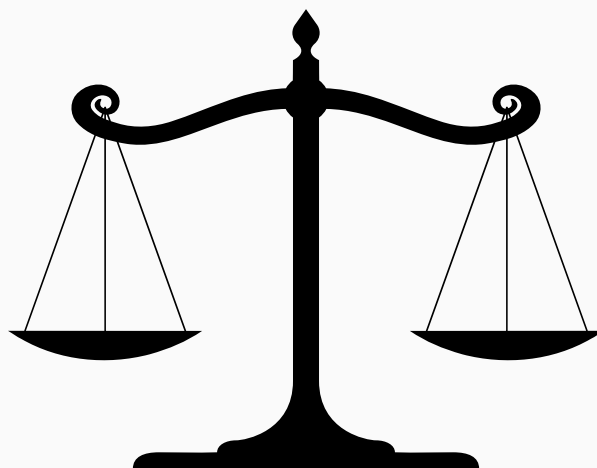
Customer acquisition, GTM.

Budgeting, compliance, growth planning

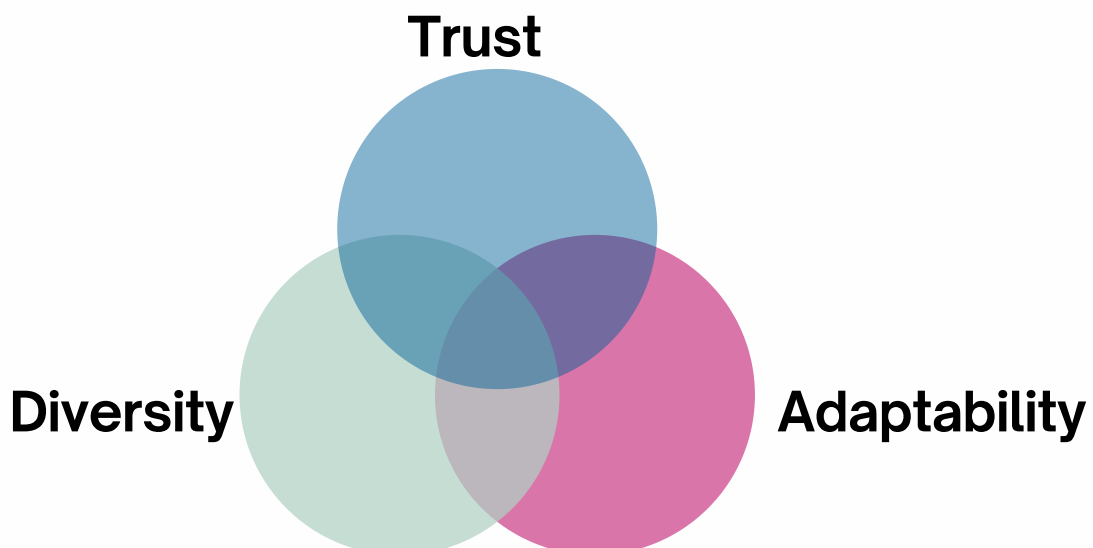
The Founder's Dilemma — Solo vs Co-Founders

Type	Pros	Cons
Solo Founder	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Full decision-making control• Clear, undiluted vision• Faster execution	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Risk of burnout & stress• Limited expertise• Harder to gain investor confidence
Co-Founders	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Shared workload & responsibilities• Diverse skills & perspectives• Stronger credibility with investors	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Potential conflicts• Equity dilution• Slower decision-making

- A mix of diverse skills but aligned purpose.



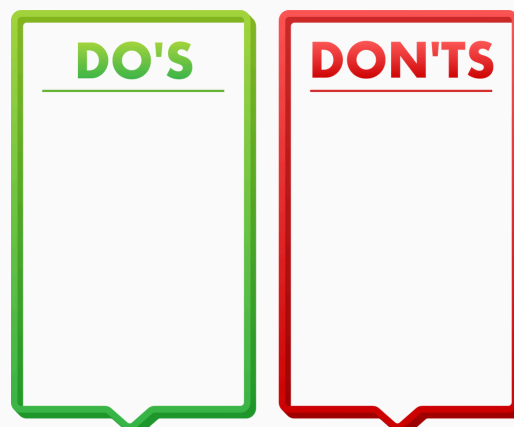
Common Mistakes to Avoid
